THIRD AUSTRALIAN WOMEN'S AMATEUR TRACK & FIELD GAMES CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Third Australian Track & Field Games Championships were admirably conducted by the N.S.W. W.A.A.A. (under the A.W.A.A.U. rules) at Rushoutters Bay on the 15th January, 1936, and at the Sydney Sports Ground on the 18th January, 1936. New South Wales W.A.A.A. must be commended on being the first State to have only Women Officials. Your Union wish to congratulate the Women Officials on the efficient manner in which they carried out their duties.

Only three States were represented (New South Wales, Queensland and Victoria). It was unfortunate that South Australia were unable to send a team. For the third time the N.S.W. team won the Doris M. Mulcahy Shield. The points gained were as follows:-

ALLIANCE WITH THE A.A.U. of A.

Your Union applied to the Amateur Athletic Union of Australia, so that its members would receive consideration when the Olympic and British Empire Games teams were being selected. They would not grant affiliation, but granted an Alliance which entitles members of the A.W.A.A.U. to receive consideration for selection to take part in these Games.

Miss Kennedy, N.S.W., and Miss Carter, Vic. were chosen by your Union to take part in the National Games at Adelaide on 26th January, 1936. Your Secretary, Mrs. Mulcahy, was chosen as Manageress. Both Miss Kennedy and Miss Carter performed admirably, both winning their respective events. Your Union extend heartiest congratulations to both members.

OLYMPIC GAMES

Miss Carter and Miss Kennedy were both nominated by your Union for selection to represent Australia at the Olympic Games. Miss Carter was ultimately chosen, and left with the team in May 1936.

She gained fifth place in the High Jump at the Games.
Your Union congratulate Miss Carter on her fine performance and inclusion in the team.

F. S. F. I.

It is with regret that your Union learned of the decision of the Federation Sportive Feminine Internationale to disband. The decision was reached after it was decided by the Amateur Athletic Federation to include more events for women on the Olympic Games programme.

AFFILIATED ASSCCIATION DISBAND.

It was very unfortunate that South Australia W.A.A.A. had to disband last November through lack of support.

NEW AFFILIATION

You will be pleased to learn that Tasmanian W.A.A.A. and Herr South Wales
W.A.A.A. have affiliated with your Union, and will take part in the Australian
Championships in Melbourne. Both these Associations were entitled to hold the
Championships in their States this year, but owing to their infancy and lack of
finance were unable to conduct them.

BRITISH EMPIRE GAMES.

Great interest is being shown in the forthcoming Championships, as they will serve as tests for the Selection Committee to choose members to represent Australia in the British Empire Games Carnival to be held in Sydney on the 5th and 12th February, 1938.

OLYMPIC FEDERATION

Each Affiliated Association is expected to subscribe through the A.A.U. of A. sixpence per member as an Olympic Levey.
