# INTERNATIONAL CROSS COUNTRY COMPETITION MOROCCO. MARCH 16th. 1975

Once again I was very honoured to be selected to captain an Australian team. We all met in Sydney and flew to Rome where we stayed overnight. On arrival in Rome the men's captain, Rob McDonald, and I met with Senor Barra, the President of the Italian Athletic Federation to discuss arrangements for us to compete in the Italian Championships. It was arranged for the four girls to travel to Verona by train with one of the members of the Federation, who incidentally didn't speak English at all, We were met in Verona and taken to our hotel. Expenses for the 4 days were taken care of by the Italian Federation. We competed in the Championships at San Martino. Elizabeth Richards was 7th, Maureen Cutler 8th, Lynne Tennant 10th and Lavinia Petric 11th. We all received a small trophy of which we were very proud.

We stayed in Rome for the rest of the week and flew to Casablanca on Sunday. Two nights were spent there and then on to Rabat by bus. The Cross Country course was at the Hippodrome el Suissi. It was flat and fast with a sandy base. There were two "obstacles" across the centre of the course. One was a ramp, the other was a ditch about 12 ins. wide. On the course proper they erected a narrow hurdle about 2 feet high along the finishing straight. Thirteen countries were represented and about 80 girls started in the race which was. won by Julie Crown from U.S.A. Australian girls placed 44, 45. 49 and 53 and finished 11th in the teams race which was also won by U.S.A.

At the presentation of trophies we did not see any athletes receive awards at all. All members of the 1.4.4.F. Committee received a souvenir/trophy and all team managers.

The results were only available to team managers and Mr. Carruthers said that he would arrange for his to be copied.

The trip on the whole was successful in spite of many difficulties which we were able to overcome. One of these being the language. Fortunately one of two of us could understand French and we managed to make ourselves understood.

Two things which came from the managers' meeting. One was a recommendation to include a race for Junior girls from 14-17 years. No distance was decided upon. In 1976 the 1.6.6. will be held at Chepstow Race Course, Wales on February 28th. There is a strong possibility that should Australia and New Zealand send teams, they would be able to arrange billets for team members.

I would strongly recommend that Australia continues to participate in this event. If it is not possible to send a team then perhaps 1 or 2 individuals could go. The standard is very high but not beyond Australia and if the girls are given the incentive to compete in this event then more will be striving for selection and accordingly the standard within Australia will improve.

i would like to thank the Selectors once again and hope that my experience gained will be passed on through Gross-Country competition in Australia.

In an endeavour to give top athletes stronger competition, a 'Najor A' grade was added to the usual interclub competition. The top 12 in track and top 6 in field events competed in this grade each week. In addition, 5 Twilight Meetings were arranged for them on the Hensley Athletic Field Tartan track, and they were also invited to compete in Twilight Meetings held by the N.S.W. Men's Association.

Whilst assisting the top group we have also been mindful of the many young athletes who strive hard and also really enjoy the Sport. In addition to the Sports Ground competition of 7 grades, a further 5 lower grades were conducted on 4 suburban grounds, and it is on these suburban grounds that the beginning of future champions can be seen.

The Winter cross country competition was conducted as usual but, unfortunately, there were a few wet Saturdays. Our athletes performed well in the Australian Cross Country/Road Walking Championships, and sincere thanks are given to the Western Australian Association for the courtesies entended to the New South Males team.

We have expanded greatly in country areas, and 6 new clubs have affiliated. With 6 Country Granches, inter-Branch competition was conducted, with the Finals of the competition being held in Canberra. There are now 44 clubs in country areas.

Our Association has for many years conducted both theory and practical examinations for technical officials, and on completion of both examinations a Certificate is given. Members of the Examination Coard travel to the country areas to conduct the practical examinations and this greatly assists the country clubs, and is appreciated by them.

The Schoolgirls Championships were again well patronised, over 1200 entries being received.

We commend the Queensland Association on the successful running of the 1975 Championships, and send our Best Wishes to the Victorian Association for a very happy and successful 1976 Championship Macting.

#### QUEENS LAND WOMEN'S ARATEUR ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION

Last July, during the winter months, the QataA.A. Council after some deliberation decided that their Interclub Competition for the 1975-76 would be combined with the Queensland Amateur Athletic Association on the new tartan track at Mount Gravatt, provided that the most important facilities were available to the women athletes.

Several meetings were held and a number of problems were ironed out to our satisfaction, but there are still many more arisen to which as yet no solution has been reached, although most things are running smoothly so far.

Although the decision to move to Mount Gravatt would allow the athletes the best track facilities to compete on, it meant that the younger groups would have to compete in the mornings from 10.00 am and the older groups in the afternoon, and officials would have to be there all day, making a long day every week, with not much chance to fraternise with the youngsters or their parents, as was the case at Downey Park.

Many fine performances have already been made on the new track, with an Australian Open record equalled.

The total registration for 1975-75 was: - 42 Seniors, 103 Juniors; 313 Sub-Juniors and 75 officials (533). Three new Clubs have affiliated, two Metropolitan (Mitchelton: Pine Rivers) and one Country (Queens Deach at Dowen), but the Gold Coast did not reaffiliate and the Toowoomba Club will be disbanded by the end of the season, to join Garden City Club in the same area.

The North Queensland Championships were conducted by the Slade Point Club, with the 1976 Titles going to Mount isa and the Copper City Club.

The Country Championships were held at Townsville and the 1976 Titles go to Garden City, Toowoomba, at Easter.

Cross Country was once again conducted and many new venues were made by the Clubs interested. The Schoolgirls Cross Country held at Marchant Park instead of St. Lucia drew a record 300 entries and seem to be more and more popular with the Schools.

Schoolgirl Track and Field Entries keep increasing and events and age groups have to be re-organised for this year, when these Championships will be held on the Mount Gravatt Track.

Our own Track and Field Championships will also be conducted over two days on the new complex, and we are hoping for some really first class performances.

The 1975/76 athletic season suffered many set backs in Hobart, firstly the North Hobart Oval was not available for the whole season, and school ovals had to be used, which proved very unsatisfactory, and it was not until late in December, that a permanent ground was established.

Interclub had to be held mostly on Sunday afternoons and the set programme could not be conducted. Complications arose as some members did not believe in participating in organised sport on Sundays.

The collapse of the Tasman Bridge made travelling conditions for the Eastern Shore Clubs, parents and officials very difficult and caused a decline in numbers.

Three new clubs have affiliated with the Association, but one club in the South has gone into recess through the lack of interest of parents to hold office positions.

Intra-State competition has been very keen, and it is noted that the sub-junior ranks have grown considerably since the introduction of the Sub-Junior Match.

Through the lack of Government Funds, the new Athletic Centre at Hobart has been delayed, but it is hopeful that the Track will be ready for use, either late February or early march, of this year.

The 1976/77 season should be an incentive to all athletes, for the first time ever, athletics in Tasmania will have their own centre, and a synthetic track, which will comply with International standards.

The sum of \$105,000 has been granted by the Federal Government for the erection of essential amenities for administration, participants and spectators. On the completion of these amenities, and the Track, with its ideal position on the Domain, I am sure that every Tasmanian who has contributed towards this very long awaited project will be very proud to share with our athletes and officials, a dream which at long last has come to fruition.

Our Association regrets that owing to circumstances beyond their control, they were unable to proceed with the organisation of the 1975 Combined Monard Women's Track and Field Championships, but we are most grateful to Victoria for their ever ready and willing assistance to hold these Championships, even though their time for proparation would be considerably lessened.

A team of seven girls representing our State; will take part in the Sub-Junior Match to be held in Adelaide during the long weekend in January.

Congratulations to our President, Mrs. Mabel Robinson, who was honoured with the M.C.E. Award, and is also a member of the office staff of the 1976 Montreal Olympics.

To our Manager of the 1976 Montreal Olympics Women's Athletic Team, Mrs. Shirley De la Hunty, we offer our congratulations and wish her every success with the Team.

### ADDENDUM




