5. Confirmation of the Minutes

Minutes of the 26th Athletics Australia Annual General Meeting held on 23 November 2010 as tabled were taken as true and correct. Moved by Tony Keynes and seconded by John Williams.

6. President and Chairman of the Board's address

The President spoke to his report as tabled in the 2010-2011 Annual Report.

The President then spoke of other key highlights since 30 June 2011.

- Three medals were won at the IAAF World Championships in August 2011. Sally Pearson (Gold, 100 m hurdles), Mitchell Watt (Silver, Long Jump), Jared Talent (Bronze, 50 km Walk)
- Australia were ranked 12th out of the 202 competing federations in top eight finishes and ranked 8th in medals out of 41 medal winning countries, 16 countries winning gold.
- The recognition of Sally Pearson's great season IAAF World Female Athlete of the Year. Congratulations to Sally were noted at the AGM.
- The opening of Lakeside Stadium will occur on Saturday, 10 December.
- The national headquarters, incorporating Athletics Australia, Athletics Victoria, Little Athletics Australia and Little Athletics Victoria is expected to occur in May, 2012.
- Gold Coast winning the 2018 Commonwealth Games.
- The announcement of London securing the 2017 IAAF World Championships.
- The Joint Venture being signed off on by the President of Athletics Australia and the President of Little Athletics Australia.
- There is better transition between Little Athletics, schools, clubs and our new Australian Junior Championships which will greatly increase the numbers of young athletes competing in our sport.
- A successful London Olympics is expected following our Beijing success of four medals which was our best since 1968.
- Congratulations were noted to Simon Hollingsworth as the new CEO of the Australian Sports Commission.

7. CEO's report to the Annual General Meeting

The CEO spoke to the meeting and provided those in attendance with an update on the 2012 AAT Season.

The National Athletics Series will consist of eight series meets and four tour meets - the Adelaide Track Classic, Perth Track Classic, Sydney Track Classic and the IAAF World Challenge (incorporating the Selection Trials).

Major funding deals have been secured with WA EventsCorp for the Perth Track Classic from 2012-14 and the National Junior Athletics Championships for 2013 and 2016. It is also pleasing to announce that Sydney Olympic Park Authority in conjunction with Destination NSW will be funding the 2012-15 Sydney Track Classics and the 2012, 2014 and 2015 National Junior Athletics Championships.

Channel 9 will be broadcasting all four tour meets and two Melbourne programs. These shows will then be broadcast on Foxtel.
