MEETING OF THE FULL BOARD OF CONTROL

Held at Melbourne, Victoria, 24th January, 1930

There were present:—

Mr. E. S. Marks, M.L.A., was voted to the Chair.

The Chairman welcomed the delegates from the different States, and apologised for the unavoidable absence of the President, Mr. R. Coombes. On behalf of the Victorian Amateur Athletic Association, Mr. G. E. Langford extended a welcome to the delegates, and stated that he was pleased to see every State represented by direct representatives, and that it was not necessary to have proxies for any State. He wished them all success in their deliberations and trusted the work done would be for the benefit of Amateur Athletics in Australia.

Minutes of Last Board Meeting

The Minutes of the last full Board Meeting, held in Wellington, New Zealand, 25th December, 1927, and the special full Board Meeting, held in Melbourne, Victoria, 1st November,

1928, and Sydney, New South Wales, 6th April, 1929, were read and confirmed.

Minutes of Executive

The Minutes of Executive for the two years ending 1st January, 1930, were received.

Hon. Treasurer's Statement of Receipts and Expenditure

The Hon. Treasurer's Statement of Receipts and Expenditure for the period 1928-29, duly audited and showing a credit balance of £2/8/8, was read and adopted on the motion of Mr. J. C. Allison (N.S.W.), and seconded by Mr. R. D'Arcy (Tas.).

Fixing of Headquarters

On the motion of Mr. G. E. Langford (Victoria), seconded by Mr. D. P. Merritt (Queensland), Sydney, New South Wales, was fixed as the Headquarters of the Union.

Election of President

Mr. J. J. Walsh (N.S.W.) moved, Mr. J. C. Allison (N.S.W.) seconded, that Mr. R. Coombes be re-elected President; carried unanimously.

Election of Hon. Secretary and Hon. Treasurer

On the motion of Mr. H. R. Weir (Vic.), seconded by Mr. G. V. Shaw (S.A.), Messrs. E. S. Marks and W. B. Alexander were re-elected to the positions of Hon. Secretary and Hon. Treasurer, respectively.

Australian Olympic Federation

Messrs. E. S. Marks (N.S.W.) and G. E. Langford (Vic.), were elected as delegates to the Australian Olympic Federation.

In reference to the performances of R. A. Gray in the 120 yards hurdles (10 flights, 3ft.

6in.), at Brisbane, July 24th, 1915, and L. F. Edmunds at Adelaide, December 31st, 1921, of 15 3/10 seconds. It was decided on the motion of Mr. H. R. Weir (Vic.), seconded by Mr. W. H. Sweeting (S.A.), that provided all certificates are submitted to the Executive, and found in order, the records be allowed.

Australian Championships

The Victorian Amateur Athletic Association asked that the sum of £250 from the net profits of the Championships be deducted as against the expenses incurred in connection with the appearance at the meeting of the International Athletes.

Decided on the motion of Mr. H. R. Weir (Vic.), seconded by Mr. W. Barwick (Tas.), to grant the request. The Union will receive 10 per cent. of the net profits of the meeting after the deduction of the sum of £250, i.e., provided the profits exceed £100.

Application for Affiliation

Mr. L. G. Drake, Honorary Secretary Amateur Walking Union of Australia (in process of formation), applied for affiliation to the Union under Rule 2, clause "D", or otherwise of the Constitution of the Union.

A copy of the proposed Constitution was enclosed.

On the motion of Mr. J. C. Allison (N.S.W.), seconded by Mr. H. R. Weir (Vic.), it was unanimously decided the application cannot be granted, and further, that if any walking race was held in the future, except of the different State Associations, the words "Australian," "Championship," "Premiership," or "Inter-state" cannot be used in con-

nection with such race or races; only such title as "Inter-club Walking Race."

Re-instatements

The Queensland Amateur Athletic Association forwarded and recommended for re-instatement as Amateurs, the applications of C. J. Milliner and E. L. Cross.

The Association had declared the cases "Special", and the Council had unanimously recommended the re-instatements owing to the unusual and exceptional circumstance affecting same. Decided to grant the applications, subject to the condition that the applicants can only compete in Australia, and the re-instatement in the case of C. J. Milliner to date from 6th May, 1930.

Australian Championship Programme

On the motion of Mr. J. C. Allison (N.S.W.), seconded by Mr. J. J. Walsh (N.S.W.), the distance of the Hurdle Race (women) was altered from 80 yards to 90 yards. The distance, however, for the present race should stand at 80 metres.

It was decided on the motion of Mr. G. E. Langford (Vic.), seconded by Mr. H. W. Massey (Queensland), that the present series of Australian Championships should be conducted under the conditions as laid down in the handbook.

Women's Athletics

On the motion of Mr. G. E. Langford (Vic.), seconded by Mr. R. D'Arcy (Tas.), a sub-committee consisting of Messrs. J. C. Allison, H. W. Massey, and G. E. Langford was appointed to draft conditions in reference to Women's Athletics, and report to the Exe-

cutive for submission to the different States. It was further decided, until new rules had been drafted, to only recognise as Australian Women Records the three events at present on the Australian Championship Programme. The application of the New South Wales Amateur Athletic Association for recognition as Australian Best on Record of Miss Rosa Winter's performance of 5 feet 3/16 inches for Running High Jump, made at the Show Grounds, Sydney, on October 7th, 1929, was held over.

Australian Championship Shield

Mr. E. S. Marks informed the meeting that the New Zealand Amateur Athletic Association had decided to hand over to the Union for competition among the different States the Shield held by them. It was decided to accept the offer, and the thanks of the Union was passed to the New Zealand Amateur Athletic Association for their kind gift. On the motion of Mr. G. E. Langford (Vic.), seconded by Mr. H. R. Weir (Vic.), it was decided to name the Shield "The Richard Coombes Shield" and record thereon that the Shield had been presented to the Amateur Athletic Union of Australia, by New Zealand.

New Handbook

It was decided to print a new Handbook, and the Executive Officers were instructed to prepare same as soon as possible. The cost of printing Handbook to be paid for by the different affiliated Associations in the following proportions:—

New South Wales, Victoria, and Queensland, £10 each; South Australia, West Australia, and Tasmania, £5 each.

British Empire Games, Canada, 1930

An invitation was received for the Union to take part in the British Empire Games to be held at Hamilton, Canada, August 16th to 21st inclusive, 1930. The list of events in the Athletic section to be same as that adopted in the last Olympic Games.

Decided on the motion of Mr. H. R. Weir (Vic.), seconded by Mr. G. V. Shaw (S.A.), that a letter be sent to the Committee, stating that we are agreeable to Australia having representation, if any State is so desirous, and the Athlete making the trip is of good standing, but the Union is unable to take part owing to distance and expense involved.

Olympic Games Fund

On the motion of Mr. H. W. Massey (Queensland), seconded by Mr. D. P. Merritt (Queensland), it was decided that the question of levy as suggested by the Olympic Federation be referred to each of the State Associations with a request that they at once consider the matter and report to the Executive.

At 6 p.m. the meeting adjourned for an hour.

Adjourned Meeting

Mr. E. S. Marks took the Chair at 7.30 p.m.

Amusement Tax

The Chairman brought up the matter of taxation as applied to Amateur Sport, and stated that the New South Wales Government had in the Amusement Tax Bill recently introduced by them, agreed to exempt from taxation, all sporting bodies which did not carry on for profit or gain by individual members, and where the whole profits were devoted

to the promotion and furtherance of athletic sports or games. It was decided to recommend that all State Associations should approach their respective Governments by deputation, and endeavour to secure exemption similar to New South Wales, and further the Union should apply for exemption from Federal Taxation as applied to Amateur Sport.

Proxy Voting

On the motion of Mr. G. A. Langford (Victoria), seconded by Mr. J. C. Allison (N.S.W.), it was decided to adopt the same procedure as the Australian Olympic Federation in regard to voting at any meeting of the Union.

Visit of International Athletes

Mr. H. R. Weir (Vic.), moved and Mr. W. H. Sweeting (S.A.), seconded, that this conference is of opinion that in the interest of the sport, further visits of International Athletes are desirable, and such visits should be encouraged by the different State Associations, and further, in all future visits of International Athletes the Union should, if possible, conduct and carry out the tour themselves. Carried unanimously.

Field Games and Jumps

Mr. H. W. Massey (Queensland) moved, and Mr. J. C. Allison (N.S.W.) seconded, That as far as any State Association is concerned, if they so desire for local competitions only, they can decide a competition by the result of the first round only. In such case this must be stated on the Programme.

Carried unanimously.

The Decathlon

Mr. H. W. Massey (Queensland), moved, and Mr. R. D'Arcy (Tas.), seconded. That

the Decathlon be replaced on the Australian Championship Programme. Lost, 6 to 3.

Throwing the Hammer

Mr. H. W. Massey (Queensland), moved, and Mr. J. C. Allison (N.S.W.), seconded, That throwing the Hammer event be replaced on the Australian Championship Programme. Lost, 6 to 4.

For—J. C. Allison (N.S.W.), J. J. Walsh (N.S.W.), H. W. Massey (Queensland), D. P. Merritt (Queensland).

Against—R. D'Arcy (Tas.), W. Barwick (Tas.), W. H. Sweeting (S.A.), G. V. Shaw (S.A.), W. Walker (W.A.), and H. R. Weir (Vic.).

Australian Marathon Championship

Mr. J. C. Allison (N.S.W.), moved, and Mr. J. J. Walsh (N.S.W.), seconded. That the Amateur Athletic Union of Australia institute an Australian Marathon Championship (26 miles, 385 yards), quadrennially, the first race to be held in New South Wales in 1930, and subsequent events to be allotted to the respective States in order of rotation to be determined. Lost, 9 to 2.

Mr. J. C. Allison (N.S.W.), moved, and Mr. J. J. Walsh (N.S.W.), seconded. That the Western Suburbs A.A.C., a Club affiliated to the New South Wales Amateur Athletic Association, having been granted permission by the Association to conduct the New South Wales Marathon Championship (26 miles 385 yards), August 30th, such event shall be called "The Australian Marathon Championship." Lost, 9 to 2.

Same voting as previous resolution.

Sports Area at Canberra

Mr. J. C. Allison (N.S.W.) moved, and Mr. J. J. Walsh (N.S.W.) seconded, that the Amateur Athletic Union of Australia approach the Federal Cabinet for the dedication of a portion of land at Canberra, Federal Capital Territory, for the purpose of athletics.

Carried Unanimously.

Position of Amateur Athletics at Canberra

Mr. G. Langford (Vic.), brought up the matter of the status of Amateur Athletes living in the Federal Capital, and it was decided to again defer any definite ruling until next Conference. In the meantime, athletes in Canberra will be eligible to compete for the State whence they came, provided that they had had bona fide residence in that State for at least six months.

Medley Relay Races

Mr. J. J. Allison (N.S.W.) moved and Mr. J. J. Walsh (S.A.) seconded:—

"That in all Medley Relay Races the shortest distances shall be run first, and the longest distances last."

After discussion the resolution was withdrawn, as it did not conform with the International Rule.

Australian Championships and International Visitors

Mr. J. C. Allison (N.S.W.) moved, and Mr. J. J. Walsh (N.S.W.) seconded, that in all Australian Championships wherein an International Athlete participates and proves successful, the title and medal be awarded to the first resident Australian to finish, in addition to a special medal to the visiting athlete. Carried, 6 to 5.

For—J. C. Allison (N.S.W.), J. J. Walsh (N.S.W.), W. Barwick (Tas.), W. H. Sweeting (S.A.), R. D'Arcy (Tas.), G. V. Shaw (S.A.).

Against—H. R. Weir (Vic.), G. A. Langford (Vic.), W. H. Massey (Queensland), D. P. Merritt (Queensland), W. Walker (W.A.).

Amendment to Rule 12

Mr. H. R. Weir (Vic.), moved, and Mr. G. A. Langford (Vic.), seconded, that Rule 12, Clause 2, be deleted and the following substituted:—

"That the Race be held during the month of August."

Carried unanimously.

Attendance of Executive

Mr. H. R. Weir (Vic.), moved, and Mr. G. A. Langford (Vic.), seconded. That when no member of the Executive of the Union is able to be present at an Australian Championship

of any description, an Honorary Representative shall be appointed by the Union to attend such event.

Carried.

Amendment to Rule 11

Mr. H. R. Weir (Vic.), moved, and Mr. G. A. Langford (Vic.), seconded, that Rule 11 be amended by adding the following:—

“Entries for all Australian Championships shall close definitely with the Hon. Secretary of the State Association conducting the meeting at least ten (10) clear days before the date of the meeting.

Carried unanimously.

Amendment to Rule 8

Mr. W. Walker (W.A.), moved, and Mr. G. A. Langford (Vic.) seconded pro forma, That Rule 8, section 2, under heading EXEMPTIONS be amended to include: “Old Boys’ races at Schools’ Sports meetings, shall be exempt from any rule disqualifying persons from competing against professionals.” Lost, 6 to 1.

For—W. Walker (W.A.).

Against—H. R. Weir (Vic.), R. D’Arcy (Tas.), G. A. Langford (Vic.), J. J. Walsh (N.S.W.), D. G. Merritt (Queensland), W. H. Massey (Queensland).

It was further decided that the ruling of the Executive on October 1st, 1929, be adhered to.

Starting—Rule 18

Mr. W. Walker (W.A.), moved, and Mr. J. J. Walsh (N.S.W.), seconded, that in Rule 18, the word “Can” on page 29, fourth line, to read “Shall”.

Carried unanimously.

Dates of Track and Field Championship Meetings

Future dates were fixed as follows:—

1932, New South Wales; 1934, South Australia; 1936, Tasmania; 1938, Queensland; 1940, West Australia.

Reinstatement Rules

The Executive were instructed to draft a rule to deal with the term "nominal offenders" and submit same to the different affiliated associations for their consideration and report.

Votes of Thanks

On the motion of Mr. H. R. Weir (Vic.), seconded by Mr. R. D'Arcy (Tas.), a hearty vote of thanks was accorded to Mr. E. S. Marks, the Chairman of the meeting, for his conduct of the business, and also to the President (Mr. R. Coombes), the Hon. Treasurer (Mr. W. B. Alexander), and the Hon. Secretary (Mr. E. S. Marks), for their conduct of the Executive work of the Union. Mr. W. B. Alexander responded.

The Chairman proposed, and it was unanimously carried, that a vote of thanks be accorded the Victorian Amateur Sports Club for the use of a room for the purpose of holding the meetings, and the Victorian A.A.A. for many acts of courtesy and kindness to the delegates and visiting athletes.

The Chairman declared the Conference closed.
