## AUSTRALIAN WOMEN'S AMATEUR ATHLETIC UNION,

### BIENNIAL REPORT AND FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Presented to delegates of affiliated Associations at the Sixth Biennial Conference of the Union, held at Sydney, New South Wales, on Thursday, 22nd January, 1948.

Ladies:

Your Executive has much pleasure in presenting its Fifth Biennial Report and Balance Sheet for your consideration.

The Union has, since its last Conference in 1940, passed through years when the attention of the youth of the nation was directed to work of national importance rather than athletic exercise. Although victorious, the nation has not yet recovered from the terrific efforts it was called upon to make to ensure that victory, and consequently even yet we await the return to normal times.

#### WAR SERVICE.

Your Union feels proud that so many of the members of the affiliated Associations assisted the war effort in His Majesty's Forces, or through special efforts in other essential directions. Some members were unable to do all they desired, and it is consequently felt on that account, and because the numbers engaged were so numerous, that individual mention would be out of place.

#### AFFILIATIONS.

Owing to so many of their members being engaged in war activities, some Associations were unfortunately forced to suspend their affiliations.

It is indeed regretted that the Queensland W.A.A.A. has been unable to re-form, and it is hoped that an application for reaffiliation will be made at an early date.

#### AUSTRALIAN CHAMPIONSHIPS.

The Fifth Biennial Championships were held at Leederville Oval, Perth on March 7th, 9th and 11th 1940, and resulted in Victoria retaining the custody of the Doris Mulcahy Shield. The Union extends congratulations to the members of the successful team.
